Ray Nemeec, who always has a number of projects in the works, needs some help on the following:

- (1) Still needs box score of Anaheim vs San Bernardino, California League, 2nd game of June 6, 1941
- (2) Two box scores for 1935 West Dixie League: Longview vs Palestine on June 13 and Longview vs Gladewater on July 8
- (3) Averages for the independent Provincial League, especially the 1948 & 1949 stats
- (4) Date and place of death of Elwood Grantham, who played in the 1940's. Possibly he died in Texas in September, 1976
- (5) Any information on Fred Wilder's career prior to World War I
- (6) Harry Lee Daughtry's record for 1933 and 1934. He played for Winston-Salem, Piedmont League, in 1935. Also, did he play in less than ten games for Charlotte, South Atlantic Association, in 1928?

## **Request From the Museum of Minor League Baseball**

We don't need material from the more recent seasons, so I'd like you to focus on the period pre-1935. We are looking for basic bio data from these sources including first name, hometown, B-T, Ht-Wt and, perhaps, other teams played with.

The Museum will send you a small baseball item to express our thanks. You will also be listed in a future newsletter highlighting the strong team of researchers working on this unique project.

## **One Pitch Almost Destroys a League**

On June 2, 1951, Ottis Johnson was killed by a pitch by Jack Clifton of Headland in an Alabama-Florida League game. At the time, Johnson of Dothan was one of the leading batters in the league, with ten homers and an average of .393. The Dothan owner refused to play any more against Clifton and wanted him released, otherwise Dothan would withdraw from the league. It looked pretty grim and the league considered going with five teams, and then with four as one other team sided with Dothan. Cooler heads finally prevailed and the league finished the season intact. Clifton led the league in W-L pct. with a 22-6 record. He was also a very good hitter, having started his career as an outfielder. After Clifton's baseball career, he became vice president of a company in Blakely, Georgia involved in the peanut business. Clifton is still alive and Ray Nemec, who supplied this story, has talked to him.

## **1948 Sooner State League**

Gene Wood wrote recently and pointed out a rare occurrence in the 1948 Sooner State League. The league batting averages list all players in ten or more games. Five of the top six batters were playing managers:

- 1 Otto Utt, Duncan, 15 G, .421
- 3 Hugh Willingham, Seminole, 47 G, .341
- 4 Ray Honeycutt, Chickasha, 89 G, .338
- 5 Vernon Hoscheit, McAlester, 123 G, .335
- 6 Murl Prather, Pauls Valley, 34 G, .333

Utt and Prather did not manage all season. Prather also played for Chickasha, but didn't manage. Gene says that he believes that Otto Utt was part owner of Duncan. Utt had been a long time catcher with the Duncan Halliburton Cementers who made the National Semi-Pro tournament almost every year in the late 1930's and early 1940's. He must have been around forty years old in 1948.

## **Minor League Baseball Stars: Volume IV**

This project is dead. About a half dozen members sent lists of candidates for inclusion in the book. One person, John Benesch, sent some completed career records. Terry O' Neil sent a long list of candidates and indicated that he has the career records for all of the players on his list. No one else has even indicated that they plan to work on any players records.

We will try to carry a list of candidates, not already listed, in a future newsletter. This will be just for general interest.

*The Minor League Register* came out in 1994 and it included almost all of the player records in the three volumes of *Minor League Baseball Stars*. Since that time, many hundreds of additions and corrections have been made to these career records. Bob Hoie is the custodian of the additions and corrections. Baseball America, publisher of *The Minor League Register*, has indicated that it does not plan to come out with another edition of the book. Hoie and Carlos Bauer are tentatively planning to put together a similar type book in several years. This book will include all of the records that are in *The Minor League Register* and 100+ records will be added to bring the total records in the new book to about one thousand. We will try to keep you up to date on the progress of this new book.

### **Farm Club Project**

Bill McMahon, with help from several other committee members, is making very good progress on the project. However this is a vast project and Bill is appealing for some help. He has compiled a list of corrections to *The Encyclopedia of Minor League Baseball*. The list also includes a number of question marks. We urge all committee members to check this list. If you have any comments on any club in your area, send them to Bill.

To help guide you, these are some of the reasons it has been a difficult task to define farm team relationships:

- (1) Teams owned by major league clubs but having little inter-club commerce, but there is a strong de facto relationship.
- (2) Minor league teams not officially affiliated with the majors, but engaging in significant dealings with one club. They are often treated as de facto or listed as farms.
- (3) The transitivity problem. Into the 1950' s minor league teams had farm teams. The only way to determine whether the latter were farms of the major league team is to review their roster.
- (4) Shifting working agreements during the season.
- (5) The problem of vague or conflicting information from a long time ago.

Because of these problems the decision on whether a minor league team was a farm team of a major league team is often a judgment call.

## Hall of Fame Teammates

We received a letter recently from a SABR member, not a member of our Committee, asking what the record is for most Hall of Fame players who were on a minor league team at the same time. We didn't know the answer, but the question got our curiosity and Bob McConnell spent the better part of a day researching it. He found fifteen cases where two Hall of Famers were on the same team, but none with more than two. In addition he found thirteen cases where two Hall of Famers were on the same team at some time during the season, but not necessarily at the same time. The two lists are shown below. Perhaps someone can research the second list to see if the players were on the team at the same time.

## Miscellaneous

Marc Okkonen has taken on a vast project. He is compiling the minor league assignments (no stats) for about 2000 players who played in ten games or less in the majors between 1900 and 1949.

Kal Zitterkob has come up with two no-hitters in 1924 which are not in *The Encyclopedia of Minor League Baseball*. On August 21, Flint Rhem of Fort Smith, Western Assn., tossed a no-hitter against Hutchinson, winning 4-0. He racked up sixteen strikeouts. On September 18, Tommy Meeks of Ardmore pitched a perfect game vs. Muskogee. This was a seven inning second game of a doubleheader. Meeks played CF in the first game.

William Morgan played in the minors from 1926 thru 1933 and from 1937 thru 1940, a total of eleven years. He never hit below .300! He did come close though, hitting .301 on three occasions. His career average was .315.

## Texas League

Bob McConnell wrote to Tom Kayser for some information on the Texas league. Tom is president of the league and a member of our committee. He was unable to supply the information, but he suggested that Bob contact two experts on the Texas League, Davis Barker and Scott Hanzelka.

Davis is a member of our committee. He has helped McConnell considerably in his personal research and has done a great deal of work on baseball in Texas. In his spare time, Davis travels all around the state gathering information. When you travel all around Texas, that is a lot of travelling. Davis also coaches and one of his star pupils was Ron Gant.

Scott is not a SABR member and Bob had never had any contact with him. After writing to Scott, he received a very nice letter. Scott appears to be very knowledgeable on the Texas League and has done a great deal of research. ## 1939 Cotton States League

Carlos Bauer has pointed out an unusual set of stats for a batter in the 1939 Cotton States League. Walter Celusta of Greenville is credited with 123 H, 83 2B, 12 3B and 8 HR. Even the yearly league summary in the guide mentions that he led the league with 83 doubles. This, of course, is an obvious error. Based on these stats, he had only 20 singles. Another interesting fact about the league averages; not one player is listed with having played for two teams. There have been several cases where league averages listed only the last team that a player played for.
