The minor league organization (NAPBL) and the major league owners approved a new ten- year agreement in October 2004 running through the 2014 season. The key points are that the major leagues will staff at least 160 minor league teams and will be used for player development. Other areas include television, marketing and statistical coordination.

### **General Information-Minor Leagues:**

The Charleston, WV (SAL) club will have a new park for the 2005 season and be known as the West Virginia Power Stadium. The club will be renamed the West Virginia Power for the financial backing of the energy company.

The Provo Angels (PL) have moved about three miles down the road to Orem,UT and will be known as the Orem Owlz—check their website for their marketing plan-I had no idea baseball was so complex. Notice the moving owl eyes.

There is now a Mexican League team in Tijuana.

Jackie Robinson Stadium in Daytona Beach (FL) has been refurbished after the hurricane damage and will include a new lighting system.

The Southern League team in Pearl (Jackson), MS, a Braves farm club, will be called the Mississippi Braves

If stadium construction is approved, Biloxi, MS will pursue an AA franchise

State College, PA may try to obtain a New York – Penn franchise, if a new baseball facility is built on the Penn State campus

Will Columbia, NC move to Greenville, SC in the SAL to fill the void there?

Will Marion, IL replace an existing franchise in the MWL?

If you are traveling, the Mexican Professional Baseball Hall of Fame (Salon de la Fama) is located in downtown Monterey in the Cuauhtemoc Brewery Gardens.

### **General information—Independent Leagues:**

There will be a new independent league operating in California in 2005—The Golden League. The eight team league will include Tijuana, MX (to share a stadium with the Mexican League team) and will play mostly in college venues –check their website for schedules and other information. The teams (except Tijuana) are owned and operated by the league.

In the Frontier League there will be a new stadium in Rockford, IL and major renovations in Richmond, IN.

Springfield /Ozark in the FL dropped out of the League without playing a game and the teams slot in the league will be road team known as the Ohio Valley Redcoats for the 2005 season.

City council recently approved financing for the upgrading of Smith-Wills Stadium for Jackson's MS entry in the Central League. This is needed to compete with the new SL team in the area.

Wayne Terwilliger, long-ago shortstop for Washington, is managing Ft. Worth (CL). At eighty years old, he second only to Connie Mack in age as an active manager.

El Paso, recently of the Texas League, replaces Amarillo in the Central League in 2005

The Lancaster, PA Barnstormers replace the Pennsylvania Road Warriors (who never had a home) in the Atlantic League for 2005. Their new facility is Clipper Magazine Stadium and their first manager is Tom Herr a native of Lancaster.

The Northeast League has changed its name to the CanAm League and as Allentown has dropped out of the league, Worcester, MA was added and will play their games at Fitton Field on the College of the Holy Cross campus. The Bangor Lumberjacks have changed sites and now play at Husson College Campus.
