## 2014 SABR Mock Hall of Fame Vote - Results

At the November 30<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Southern New England SABR chapter, we held a mock Hall of Fame voting. We follow the same rules as the actual Hall of Fame election...each voter can vote for a maximum of 10 eligible players and a player must appear on 75% of all ballots to be elected.

This year, we had 40 ballots submitted (and as far as I can tell, nobody sold theirs to Deadspin), meaning a nice even 30 votes was the 75% threshold.

Despite a stacked ballot, we managed to elect three players to the Hall of Fame, all players in their first year of eligibility.
