

## New Player Discovered

Jack Snyder, who had caught for Brooklyn in 1917, had also been credited with catching one game for Buffalo in the Federal League in 1914. Peter Morris found a note in the Buffalo paper that the Buffalo catcher, Chubby Snyder, was a local semi-pro. One might think that finding a local semi-pro known as "Chubby" might prove a bit difficult. Fortunately, there is a website that has several papers from upstate New York for that era and Peter was able to find our missing player rather quickly. An obituary in the Niagara Falls Gazette laid it all out very nicely:

"A former major league baseball player and owner of a tile and marble business here for 34 years, Alfred J. Snyder, 63, of 8632 Champlain Ave., died yesterday in Millard Fillmore Hospital, Buffalo. He had been ill for about a year. Born in Buffalo he lived in this city 24 years. He was a veteran of World War I and played several years of semi-professional baseball in Western New York when he was known as 'Chubby' Snyder. He played with the Pittsburgh Pirates one year in the National League. He was a catcher.

He was a member of the Niagara Falls Rotary Club, Home Builders and Builders Assn. as well as the National Association of Tile and Marble Contractors. He also was a member of St. John de LaSalle Church. Funeral arrangements are being made but friends may call at the residence. In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that donations be sent to the American Cancer Society, 1901 East Falls St. Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Jeannette Snyder; his father, Frank J. Schneider, Buffalo; a sister, Mrs. Willis Maischoss, Buffalo; a brother, Frank L. Schneider, Buffalo, and two nephews."

Although the obituary said that he played for the Pittsburgh Pirates rather than the Buffeds, this is clearly the correct player. Congratulations to Peter for winning the *Find of the Month* award.

### Another Snyder

Believe it or not, there was another Snyder, also a catcher, who was found to be misidentified. Cooney Snyder caught for Louisville in 1898. The ballplayer was managing a hotel in Toronto in 1912. The 1911 Canadian census showed Abraham Conrad Snyder managing a hotel in Toronto. Cooney appears to have been a nickname for Conrad.

### Dan Phelan

Dan Phelan played for Louisville in 1890. Phelan played for several years in Waterbury, Connecticut, but the player we had listed didn't move to Waterbury until he was 46 years old. Richard Malatzky found Phelan listed in the Waterbury city directories from 1885-1893 as a ballplayer. Richard was able to find this man's family tree on Ancestry. He wrote to the man who had done the family tree and the man, who was the ballplayer's great-great-grandson, wrote back to Richard, giving him all the pertinent information. He knew that his ancestor was a ballplayer and had been disappointed that another man had been listed in the baseball records. It's nice that we are now able to correct that

mistake.

## Fred Smith

Fred Smith had a pretty good year for a guy who only pitched one year, going 19-13 for Toledo in 1890. Of course it would be nice if we credited this season to the right man. Richard Malatzky found a couple of big clues in Sporting Life. Fred Smith married Julia Weber in Toledo November 28, 1889. Nine months later, his son was born, a fact that was noted in Sporting Life. It also mentions that he was living on Jerome Street in Toledo, and the city directory shows Ferdinand C. Smith at 2259 Jerome. Richard was able to follow Fred and Julia through the census and city directories until he moved to Chicago where his son lived. A search of the Illinois death certificates found his death and the wife and birth information all matched. The real Fred Smith died November 19, 1926 in Chicago.

## Ed Springer

Another misidentified player was Ed Springer, one-game pitcher for Louisville in 1889. Peter Morris found several notes that Springer was from Detroit rather than from California. An important note mentioned that he was the brother of a well-known Detroit lawyer. That lawyer was Oscar Springer, and Peter was able to find the family in the 1871 Ontario census. Edward Ellsworth Springer was three years old and the family lived in Oil Springs, Ontario. Peter searched for a death and found Edward Springer died December 18, 1891 in Minneapolis, Minnesota, age 22, born in Canada. The cemetery records showed that he was buried with his mother and his sister. Clearly, we have the right man.

## Walter Terry

Peter Morris showed that Wallace Terry, who played for Washington in 1875, was also misidentified. The correct player is Walter Terry. Here is the proof that Peter found:

*I just found the following article in the Reading Eagle of July 23, 1899, which is online (google news archive, free): "Walter Terry, who was the old first baseman on the '75 Washington ball team, was the guest of his old friend, Larry Ressler, on Saturday evening. They had not met since they played ball together on the same team in '75 and the occasion was one of mutual interest. Mr. Terry is now a conductor of the New York division of the Penn'a road and will shortly pay another visit to Reading as the guest of Mr. Ressler."*

*That points directly to a different man and, I believe, proves that he rather than Wallace was the major leaguer. The right man was listed as a conductor in the Philadelphia cds from the 1880s until his death in 1908. He was also mentioned in the 1898 book "Nine thousand miles on a Pullman train: an account of a tour of railroad conductors (also on google books), which features a splendid photo of Terry (p. 174) and these comments about him: "Brother Terry is a conductor on the New York Division, and a member and trustee of West Philadelphia Division No. 162; he is a member of the excursion executive committee, the heavyweight of the party, whose herculean strength and sound judgment can always be relied upon." No question of the match.*

*Terry died in an accident on February 20, 1908, while still a conductor on the New York Division of the Pennsylvania railroad. Nobody witnessed the accident, so the details in the Jersey Evening Journal on February 21, 1908 and the following day's Philadelphia Inquirer (both on genealogybank.com) were not entirely consistent. He was found lying beside the tracks in Colonia, New Jersey, and "it was supposed that he was looking out from the side of the train and that his head came in contact with a post of the fence that runs along the railroad at Colonia." He was not yet dead, but his condition was severe enough that all he was able to say was "I'll soon be dead." He was taken to the General*

*Hospital in Elizabeth – the Inquirer said he died in the ambulance while en route, while the Evening Journal stated that he died an hour after arriving at the hospital.*

Ouch! That sounds like a bad way to go. National Association players are always tough to identify, so it is great that we were able to pin this guy down.

## **William Hughes**

Here is yet another misidentified player. William Hughes played first base for Washington in 1884 and pitched for Philadelphia in 1885. Since the player we listed was 17 when he debuted, he was suspicious. Richard Malatzky was able to determine who the missing player was, and I thought I would just provide the details as Peter Morris did to show you how all these little facts come together to prove the identity of the player.

*Cincinnati Commercial Tribune 1/17/1884 signed by Peoria William W. Hughes.  
Reach's 1884 Guide has William Hughes, from Pennsylvania, with Peoria as a first baseman. Spalding Guide lists William W. Hughes.*

*Box scores have Hughes playing first base for Peoria. According to Reed, Hughes played for Peoria from 5/2 to 8/4. The major leaguer debuted 9/28/84. Cincinnati Commercial Tribune 10/6/1884 "Hughes of the Nationals was lately released by the Daytons."*

*SL 6/17/1885, 7, "In Billy Hughes Dayton has one of the coming pitchers of the country." Dayton folded in late May.*

*Cleveland Plain Dealer June 23 1885 Norfolk has grabbed Hughes, the Dayton left handed pitcher.*

*SL 9/23/85 Athletics vs St Louis at Philadelphia. Hughes, the late pitcher of the Norfolk Club made his debut. Philadelphia Inquirer also notes when Hughes signed say that he was a pitcher for Norfolk. Reed has his Norfolk dates as 6/22-8/29. His two games pitched for Philadelphia were on 9/19 and 9/29 and his final game on 10/5.*

*SL Vol 5 #24 1885 Athletic vs St Louis September 19 1885 Hughes late pitcher of the Norfolk Club made his debut with the Athletics.*

*SL 1/13/1886 Shenandoah, Pa during thee winter has Hughes the pitcher late of the Norfolk and Athletic Clubs for a resident.*

*SL 3/30/87 letter from Pat Powers, the Jersey City manager, giving a list of 1887 players. He said that William Hughes was a good left-handed pitcher, batter and base-runner who had pitched for Norfolk in 1885 and had signed with Jersey City in 1886 but had not reported due to family opposition. No other details. Powers obviously assumed Hughes would play for Jersey City but there's no record that he did.*

*Shenandoah is in Schuylkill County, which points to this:*

*History of Schuylkill County, Pa: James M. Hughes, harness maker, was born in Morristown, N. J., December 13th, 1826, and came to Schuylkill county in 1848, following his trade in Tamaqua, New Philadelphia and other places. He was married in 1857 to Lucy Wineland, of New Jersey. He served nearly four years during the war of the Rebellion with the "three months' men" and the 114th Pennsylvania volunteer infantry.*

## Mister Meister is our Mystery

With all of the misidentified players we have this month, it seems only fitting that our *Mystery of the Month* would be a player that had been misidentified as well. George Meister played 34 games for Toledo in 1884, compiling a nifty .193 batting average. Richard Malatzky searched Sporting Life for notes on this player, and found a couple of significant clues. He was unmarried, worked as public school director, and lived at 118 Spring Garden Avenue, Allegheny, Pennsylvania. This eliminated the player we had listed, as he immigrated to the United States from Germany in 1883, and had been married for 15 years.

The actual ballplayer was listed in the Pittsburgh city directories for many years, and became a cigar maker. He appeared in the 1900 census, and was the son of George and Barbara Meister, both of whom were born in Germany. He was born in Maryland in 1854. His last census entry was in 1920 and he was always listed as single. He last appeared in the city directory in 1923.

It would seem that given this information it should be fairly easy to find him, but remember that this is Pennsylvania. Chances are good that the entire Meister family is buried in the Pittsburgh area, so if anyone has a line on some Pittsburgh records, maybe we can track him down.
